In our daily lives we owe much to filtration. Our drinking water, beverages, pharmaceuticals, foods, clothing, electronic devices and computers, autos and trucks, electricity/power plants rely on filtration technology. Treatment of waste water and liquid chemical wastes need filtration to avoid pollution. Engineers need to be familiar with the basics of the filtration process. Process equipment requires lube oil filtration. Health factors necessitate careful attention to filtration performance. Municipal processing of water, sewage, and storm water heavily depend on filtration.

Unfortunately, in today's college curricula, engineering students receive only scant details of filtration; plant engineers and manufacturers have to learn about filtration by the "seat of the pants." Therefore, the Dixie Chapter offers the Clinic to provide brief and hard hitting exposure to the world of filtration to the attendees..
